8. Hamblet Cabin

This is an original log cabin built between Bloomfield and Farmington in 1880 by F.W. Hamblet. With just one room and a dirt floor the conditions were rather primitive compared to what we are accustomed to today.

9. Citizens Bank

The Citizens Bank was established in Aztec in 1905. Although the building is new construction, the tellers' cages are from the 1910 bank building, which is still located on Main Avenue.

10. Farmhouse

This is a reproduction of an early upscale farmhouse. The furnishings date from the turn of the 20th century to approximately 1920s. Electricity was in use in Aztec by 1912 but it was not always reliable. In the Farmhouse is a Thunder Mug.

11. Village Church

This community church was built in 1906. Originally it was a bit larger than it is now. It was dismantled and reconstructed at a slightly reduced, scale to correspond with the rest of the village. The pews, pulpit, piano, and hymnals are all original.
