Dear America: Letters Home From Vietnam

This award-winning film features letters written by U. S. soldiers, archival footage and music from the Vietnam Era. The running time is 86 minutes. The film is rated PG-13 and contains scenes of brief nudity, crude language, violence and graphic war scenes.



Vietnam Elegy - Vietnam veteran and artist, Denham Clements, created a mixed media painting, "*Vietnam Elegy*," in 2015 and donated it to the Memorial in 2017. The painting is "a tribute to the men and women who fought in the Vietnam War... (it) is forever dedicated to them and their families."

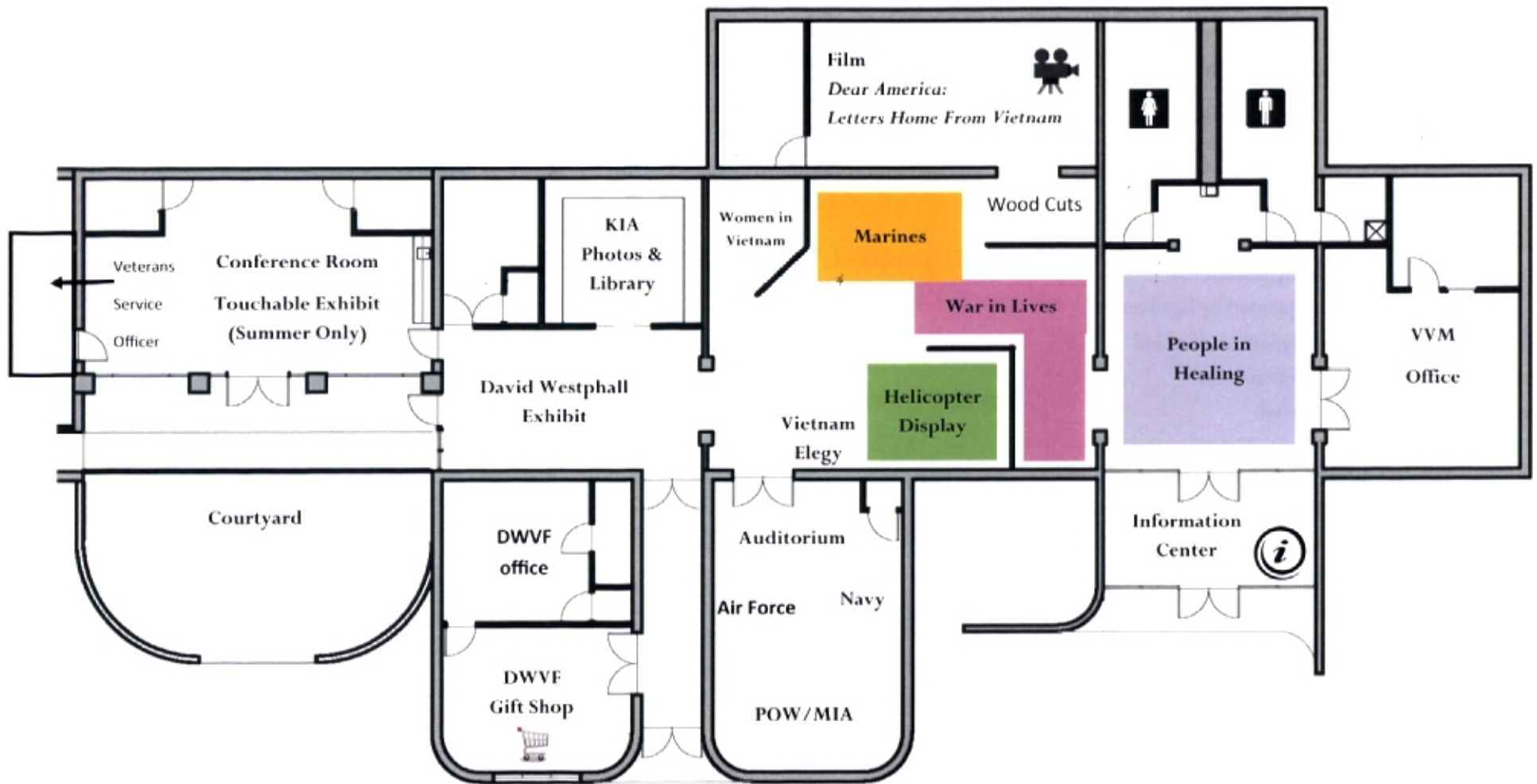
