Xenolith Cave is for the more adventurous, experienced, and well prepared caver. Rooms such as the "Large Intestine" and "Small Intestine" evoke the almost organic shape of these pristine volcanic passages. The cave's name comes from the geologic term for the pieces of non-volcanic rocks found embedded in its walls.

Drive to Cave - Easy


Take Highway 53 to the El Calderon turn off, and follow the well-maintained gravel road 0.3 miles to the trailhead.

Hike to Cave - Easy

The hike is 0.7 miles (one way) on a well-maintained trail. Signs indicate the route into the cave. Please note that Bat Cave, opposite the entrance to Xenolith, is closed year-round to protect important bat colonies.

Caving Difficulty – Extremely Difficult

After the first 100 feet, a ten-foot climb and very tight crawlways are part of this caving adventure. This cave is for experienced cavers with appropriate equipment and physical conditioning. There is no trail in this cave, and scrambling over large, unstable boulders is common.
