Fishing

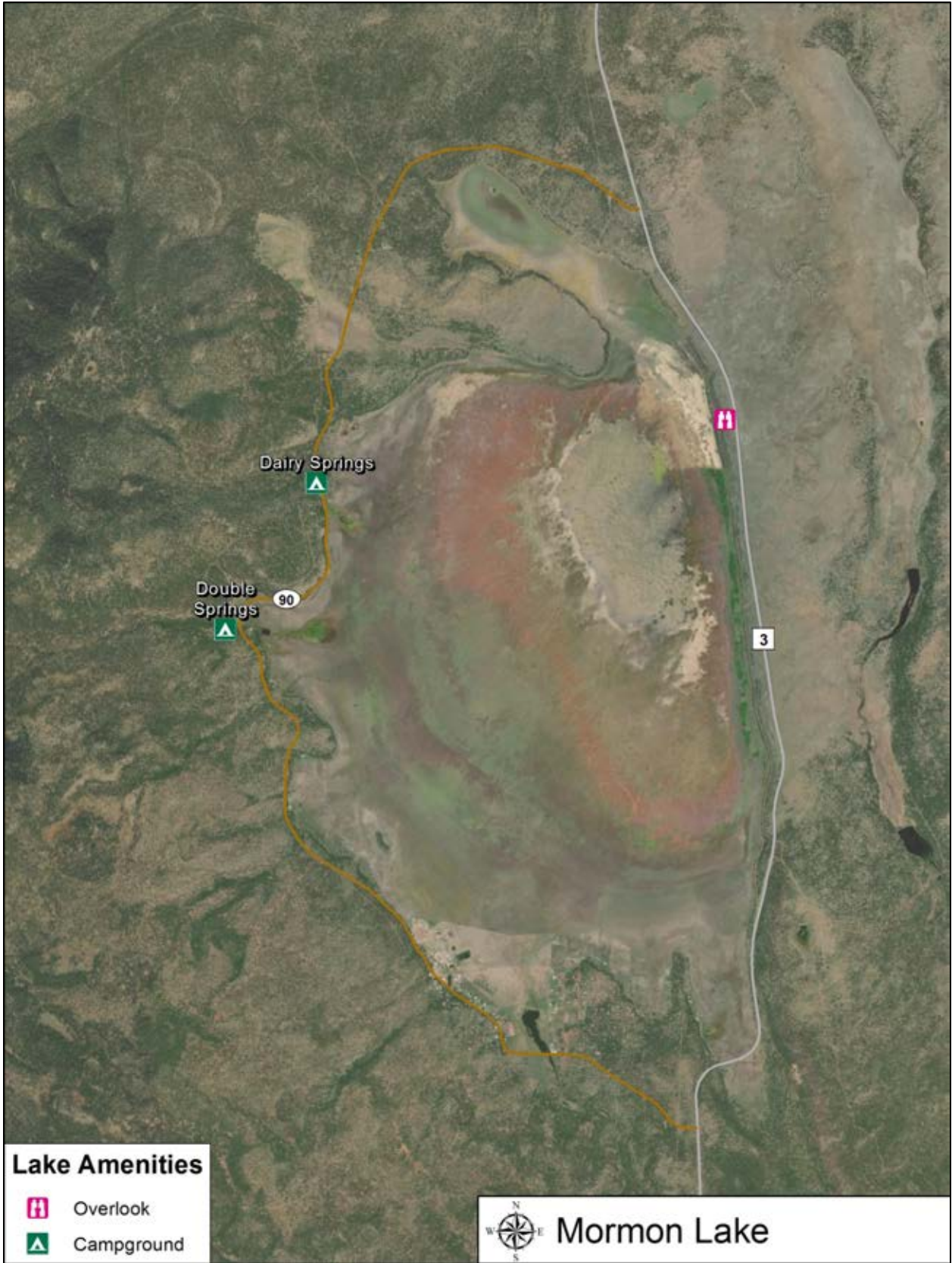
The lake is periodically stocked with trout.
