HAWKINS PRESERVE





Hawkins Preserve consists of 122 acres of southwestern landscape dedicated to the conservation of biological resources of this region, reflecting over 2000 years of human occupation and diverse habitats that made it possible. Donated by Mr. Jack Hawkins to the Cortez Cultural Center, the preserve is open to the public and managed according to a conservation easement held by Montezuma Land Conservancy.

LEAVE NO TRACE
