No wake boating, fishing, hiking, hunting, wildlife viewing, and ATV trails.

Boat ramp is located at the northwest end of the lake.

Teal Campground

Overlooking Williams Creek reservoir, this is a relatively open with little shade. There are 16 campsites, water is available, vault toilets and trash pickup. Host often on the site.

Williams Creek Campground

Located 1 mile south of the reservoir along Williams Creek, there are about 67 campsites. Vault toilets and water is available. Fire wood may be purchased from the camp host.


